Preparing your pool for the winter season

Although the Australian winter is not as cold as other places, your swimming pool requires special care in cooler seasons.

Start with a deep clean - If you are planning to stop using your pool in winter, make sure you give it as good a clean as possible by scrubbing the walls & floor, making sure you clean the corners and remove all of the debris. This will protect your swimming pool from algae forming. No matter how well your swimming pool cleaner has been serving you over the summer, make sure you manually perform the final swimming pool clean up yourself.

In order to keep the water fresh you need to super-chlorinate before the cooler seasons starts and during winter as well. Run the filtration for a couple of hours to distribute the product through the pool.

Ensure all your equipment works - Now, when you have finished preparing your swimming pool for cold weather, you need to clean the pool filters and all the equipment you have been running all summer. This can include salt water chlorinators, pumps, pool cleaners, or any other tools you have been using. They all need a very good clean. This will prevent germs and debris from spreading in your water. Any dirt such as scum or scaling left in the filter over winter will be a nightmare to remove when you want to start using your pool again. Therefore, make sure your pool filters, skimmers and everything else are in great condition.

Do not forget to run filtration for an adequate amount of hours each day to make sure the pool remains in a clear & healthy state. It is a good prevention method to simply make sure your equipment is in good shape which means less hassle in summer when it is time to enjoy your swimming pool, not waste time fixing it.

Check the Water - Finally, before you stop using your pool, check the PH, Chlorine & alkalinity levels. If you are not sure, you can always ask the experts at Donemans.
